Again, think about the creation, now our answer is almost simplified (that's when we don't think much about it!) But, this is not as easy as it appears.

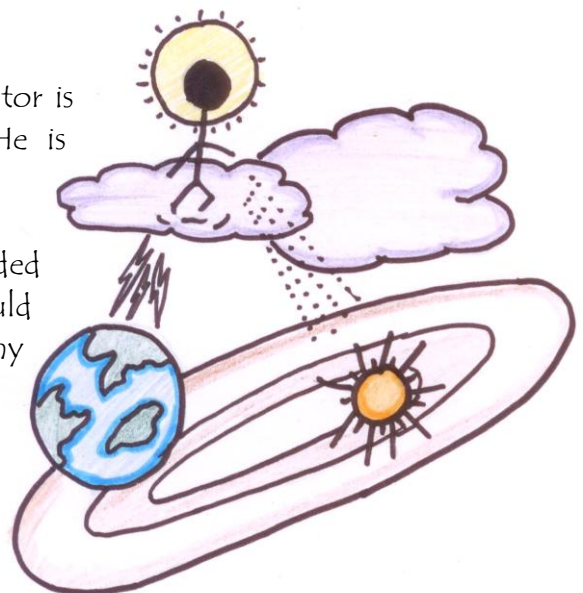
The argument is given in the following paragraphs:
